# Report of the Librarian.

TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE LAWRENCE FREE  
PUBLIC LIBRARY:

Herewith is respectfully submitted my report of the work of the Lawrence Free Public Library during its fourth fiscal year ending December 31st, 1908.

The year 1908 proved a memorable one in the growth of the public library. The total gain was 1230 volumes, 1000 of which were added by purchase and 230 by gift.

The list of donors of books is as follows: Mrs. R. B. Preuszner, Carl Mettner, R. C. Johnston, F. D. Smith, L. E. Whipple, Mrs. H. P. Wilson, Mrs. C. S. Hall, A. Carnegie, E. Bumgardner, A. D. Schoch, Chas. Bradley, P. D. Ridenour, First Church of Christ, Scientist and First Methodist church.

The books presented by the Methodist church comprise the Marvin collection donated to the church many years ago by Mrs. James S. Marvin, and were given to the library that they might have a wider circulation.

The books purchased from the Perkins Memorial fund and those purchased from the money given by the Teutonia club are included in the gift book statement.

Among books purchased were 146 volumes of back numbers of periodicals,—volumes necessary toward the completion of our periodical files. These files will doubtless be completed by another year, making this a valuable reference department.

The total accessions are 9646. Books worn out and withdrawn from circulation numbered 138, making the number of volumes now on the shelves and in circulation 9508, which are classified as follows:

There has been a gain of 3778 volumes over the circulation of last year, 712 volumes of this gain being in the young peoples department.

There were 5140 miscellaneous books used as reference in the reading room, a gain of 298 over last year. This record is kept to show the amount of reference work done in the library. If it were not necessary to hold a certain class of miscellany for use in the reading rooms our statistics of miscellany circulated would be more than doubled.

There have been 502 volumes rebound and 184 volumes of periodicals bound, a total of 686 volumes, 23 less than last year.

No record is kept of books repaired, but the average is not less than 75 a month.

Application cards on file now number 2698, an addition of 995 during the year.

Mrs. L. H. Perkins presented to the library two book-stacks which will hold 1000 volumes each. The accessions of 1908 were made possible by Mrs. Perkins' generosity.

An oil painting of Lincoln was presented by Mrs. J. T. Shanklin. This portrait is an heirloom of Mrs. Shanklin's family, and the work is of unusual merit.

Mr. Harry Dick continues to send receipted bills for dusters, brushes and other supplies which habit merits our thanks.

The Librarian with Miss Jackson of the high school spent one morning in giving to the Sophomore class at the library building, instruction in the practical use of the Library. This work was commenced two years ago with Miss Wood's classes, and resulted in great good to the students, as by doing their own reference work their field of knowledge is broadened. We hope hereafter to make this instruction a feature of the library administration.
