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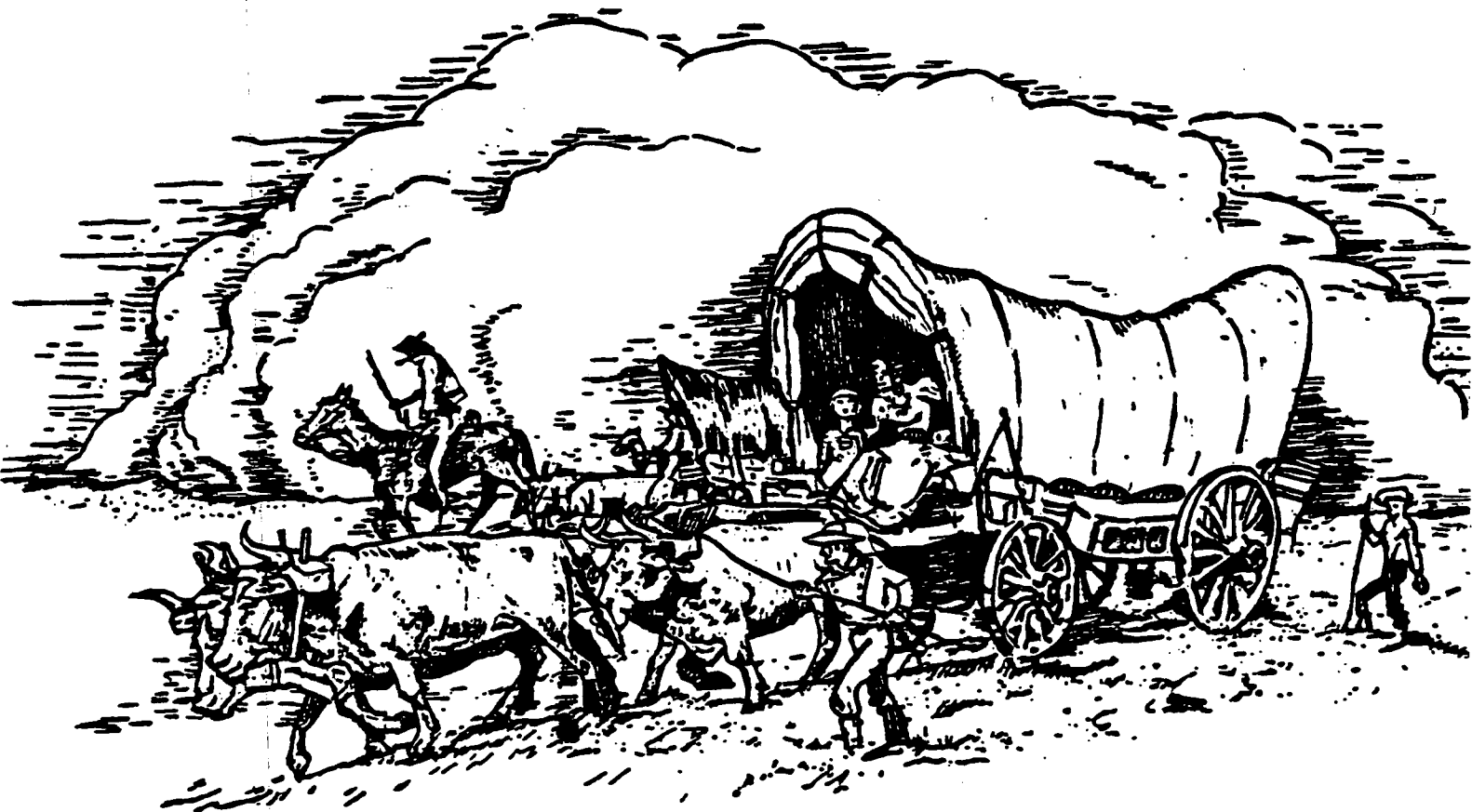

SOURCES FOR GENEALOGICAL INFORMATION

Lawrence, Kansas (Douglas Co.)

A. University of Kansas Libraries

On campus

1. Spencer Research Library (Kansas Collection) - Many biographies of early Kansas residents; diaries, county histories of Kansas; maps and atlases, such as Sanborn City Maps 1880's to 1920's, county and city plat maps for Kansas, etc.; city directories; Douglas county court records, such as tax rolls, register of deeds mortgage records, jail books, etc. (originals) - some from 1855; several old Kansas newspapers on microfilm; photograph collection; and many other original documents and letters relating to Kansas settler and Kansas history; slave narratives on microfilm.
2. Spencer Research Library (Documents Section- basement) - Census materials (on microfilm) State of Kansas 1855-1915 (ten year intervals) and Kansas Federal 1854-61 and 1860, 1870, 1880, 1900 and 1900 Soundex. Many government documents such as Kansas Claims, State Papers, Land papers. Several indexes to the government documents, especially helpful is the index called Grassroots America.
3. Watson Library - Jayhawk Boulevard, University of Kansas - Many books on various states. Several county histories, especially for Missouri and Kansas; Biography and Genealogy Master Index (at reference desk) lists biographical sources; various Who's Who volumes; a series of books of slave narratives. Some microfilm copies of various newspapers in the U.S.; Draper Collection on microfilm.
4. Law Library (Green Hall) - 15th Street - Some indexes which give names of individuals involved in certain kinds of court cases, some dating back to about 1700.

B. Lawrence Public Library - 707 Vermont St. - Old city directories for Lawrence, beginning 1860; many old Lawrence newspapers on microfilm dating back to 1855; Lawrence phone books dating back to 1916 (not all years are available); Many biographical books and other volumes which concern the History of Kansas and Lawrence (most are stored in a glass case in the library); Index to the Rural Cemeteries of Douglas Co. Also, housed at the Lawrence Public Library are the Douglas Co. Genealogical Society holdings including many exchange quarterlies from various states and the D.A.R. holdings which includes many volumes of genealogical and historical interest.

C. Watkins Community Museum - 1047 Massachusetts St. - Exhibits showing various aspects of the history of Douglas Co., Kansas.

Douglas Co. Sources continued:

- D. Judicial and Law Enforcement Building - 11th and New Hampshire Sts. - Naturalization records beginning about 1906; probate records; marriage records dating back to the 1860's; divorce records; etc. (District and Circuit Courts located in this building.)
- E. County Courthouse - 11th and Massachusetts Sts. - Tax records; register of deeds and mortgages (old deeds and mortgages are on microfilm); some copies of old Douglas Co. maps (one showing land ownership) are available for sale in the basement.
- F. Oak Hill Cemetery, 1605 Oak Hill

Oliver Clark died last Friday and was buried on the Sabbath. He was a member of the G.A.R. and the Post turned out with the S. of V. to pay their dead brother and hero their last tribute of respect. The funeral was held at Pleasant Grove Church and was largely attended. The Christian Minister of Lawrence preached the funeral service, Mr. Clark being a member of that denomination.

Lecompte: We understand that a city to be named Lecompte, in honor of the Chief Justice of this Territory, is being laid out on the Kansas river, about 12 miles above this point, and a few miles above Douglas, by Mr. Geo. Clark, formerly Indian agent in Kansas. A surveyor is already on the ground, and has commenced operations surveying out the streets, &c. Mr. Clark is the man that destroyed the house of our friend, Jones, several weeks since, and figured as one of the indignant sovereign squatters at the late indignation meeting in this city.

Post Office: C. W. Babcock, Esq. has been appointed Postmaster of this city. He will soon commence the building of an office on Massachusetts street. A two-horse hack, to carry the mail from Lawrence to Westport, Mo, twice a week will commence running in a few days.

A Free School in Lawrence: A free school was commenced in this city a few weeks since, taught by Mr. Fitch. A meeting of the citizens was held on the evening of the 18th inst., at the school room. The meeting was organized by the choice of Mr. Samuel F. Tappan, President and Dr. S.C. Harrington, Secretary. A school committee of three was appointed for the ensuing year, consisting of Dr. Robinson, Dr. Doy, and J. S. Emery, Esq. Mr. Samuel F. Tappan was chosen clerk. We are informed enough money has been subscribed to carry on the school for three and a half months.

Lawrence Athaeneum: The following gentlemen constitute the officers of the Athaeneum: J. S. Emery, President; A. H. Mallory, C. S. Pratt, Vice-Presidents; John Hutchinson, Corresponding Secretary; E. D. Ladd, Recording Secretary and Treasurer; S. N. Wood, Librarian; C. Robinson, S. C. Pomeroy, S. Y. Lum, John Mailey, S. J. Willis, Regents.

The following are examples of the many interesting testimonies to be found in the two volumes of "Kansas Claims". These claims were made by Kansas citizens in the 1850's and often contain information concerning place of origin, names of family members, political views, etc. Volumes may be consulted in the Documents Section of Spencer Research Library on the University of Kansas Campus, Lawrence, Kansas.

In the matter of the petition of Benjamin S. Hancock.

Margaretta Hancock, sworn, says: That she is the wife of petitioner, and that in the years 1855 and 1856 we were living on our claim two and a half miles from Lecompton. He was from Pittsburg, Pennsylvania, and a free-State man, and not in good odor with the people of Lecompton on account of his political opinions. In the year 1855, during the Wakarusa war, Mr. Hancock came to Lawrence to save his life, and help, while protecting himself, to protect others. While he was gone, some men from Lecompton came and threw down our fences, and the cattle got in and destroyed our corn. There were nine or ten acres in corn; it was sod corn. Mr. Hancock had gathered a little of the corn to feed with before he came down to Lawrence; the rest destroyed. It was pretty good sod corn. This was all we lost of much value during that year.

In the month of August or September, 1856, while my husband was absent-- having fled to save his life--a company of men, calling themselves Kickapoo Rangers, about fifty in number, came to our house. It was Sunday morning. They were commanded by one John Randolph. He paraded his men before the house, ordered the men to go in and search the house, and take what they could find for the use of the southern army. The men entered the house from both sides, began swearing, saying we had a store for the abolitionists at Lawrence, but they would not get it. Then they commenced plundering; some in one room; some in the other; some up stairs, turning over the beds, taking the blankets, swearing they were too good for abolitionists; inquired for Mr. Hancock; swore if they had him they would kill him. They took coffee, sugar, crackers, meat, harness--several sets, &c.

They took all my provisions. I expostulated with them; told them they were gentlemen to take all I had to eat, my husband being gone, and I having two little ones to attend to. Mr. Lamb then took a piece of meat, some dried fruit, and a washpan full of coffee, and gave them to me. Captain Randolph got mad, ordered Mr. Lamb to leave his company, as his conduct was a disgrace to it; that he was a coward and a traitor to his company. Lamb said he would not see a woman hungry. Pistols were drawn by Randolph, who said the next thing taken out of the wagon he would shoot the man who did it. Lamb wanted to leave a sack of flour, but was compelled to give it up. Randolph made a speech, saying, among other things, he would go over with his things to Lecompton, and come back again. They broke and destroyed everything they could lay their hands on that they did not carry away. That afternoon about 300 men came on horseback, accompanied by some wagons; picked up what they wanted, threw down the fence; drove and rode through the cornfield, set fire to the house three times, but it was put out. The barn and its contents they burnt down. There were in it ploughs and chests of tools and everything necessary to carry on a farm.

Between the two visits on that day I had obtained a guard from Colonel Cooke, and had thrown a few light things into the wagon. The last body who came even tried to rob the wagon of the few things it contained, but were successfully resisted by the guard.

Myself and mother came back to the house after the barn was burned, and, waiting till dark, hid some things by covering them up in the garden, but they were all stolen and broken up.

The items in the house and barn, as set down in the petition, were all carried away, destroyed, or burned up at that time, except the items for spoons. There

were twelve large spoons, silver, worth \$36, and 12 small ones, worth \$10; these were carried away. The preserves were worth \$1 per gallon. Ten acres of corn and over were destroyed at the same time, the fence being thrown down. What they did not pack off, the cattle and hogs destroyed. An acre of potatoes was also dug up and destroyed. Three horses were taken off.

When Mr. Hancock came into the Territory he brought twenty-five wagon loads of goods, such as is set out in his petition, and two loads afterwards.

Testimony

Douglas County, ss:

Sophia Eggert, being duly sworn, says; I am the wife of petitioner, Henry Eggert; on the 14th day of September, 1856, we lived on our claim, about a mile southwest of Franklin, in this county, and have lived there since; a great many men came to our house that day; Mr. Eggert was hid; it was the day Franklin was burned; they took away some of our chickens, we had over a hundred before they came, and they only left us forty; they were worth \$4 per dozen; I would not take three bits a-piece for them; they took all our bed clothes, left our feather beds, took an umbrella, razor, carving knife, two butcher knives, chair, and many other things that I can't remember, worth, in all, \$200.; they took four of our best milch cows, worth \$45 apiece; they rode our horse till he was so hurt that we thought he would die; they rode him one night and one day only, we could not use him all summer; I don't know how much he was damaged, I think at least \$50.

E. B. Johnston, sworn, says: I know petitioner, have known him for three years, during all which time he has lived in this Territory, and is a citizen of the Territory now; I am his near neighbor; in the month of September, at the same time Franklin was burned, the army that burned Franklin, under General Reed, drove off four cows, the property of petitioner; I was taken prisoner, saw the cows of petitioner with twenty or thirty other of my neighbors' cattle driven off in that drove; other droves were added to these from time to time, and all penned in the lot of Billy Wallace, in Franklin; the cows were worth \$30 each; he has never recovered them; I know nothing of his other losses.

pp 31-32 Alexander LEWIS, b Tompkins County, NY near village of Jacksonville 13 Nov 1830; to Lawrence fall of 1857; m Mary L. NORTH fall of 1863; d 30 Jan 1905 leaving an only son.

p 32 S. N. SIMPSON, (newspaper clipping no date) eighty-nine years old; helped found Lawrence 1854; suggested its name after Amos G. LAWRENCE of Boston; gave \$10,000 to start the fund that fixed University of Kansas at Lawrence. John BROWN and Mr. SIMPSON were roommates in Lawrence, and when BROWN left, he gave SIMPSON all his personal effects. He financed the first bridge built across the Kaw at Central Avenue.

paper clipping) by William Herbert CARRUTH reprinted from the Pacific Unitarian. She was born at Buffalo, NY, the daughter of Rev. John BROWN, a Unitarian Minister; to California 1912; d 11 Aug 1923. She was widely known as a Unitarian Missionary... "She was actively interested in many reform movements. At one time she was president of the Kansas State Federation of Women's Clubs. She was a personal friend of Susan B. Anthony and Lucy Stone, and her near kindred cherish the certificate of The National Woman's Suffrage Association honoring her as a pioneer. She rejoiced in the recollection that she had seen the triumph of three great reforms: emancipation, universal suffrage, and prohibition, and she had faith that the cause of international peace would soon be won. She worked as earnestly as she could in the International League for Peace."

His wife was the daughter of Col. S. W. ELDRIDGE and they had three sons. He died 8 Nov 1911.

Our fathers crossed the sea,
To make the west as they the east,
The homestead of the free."

"There remain now in Lawrence but two others of that historic party, Mr. Forest SAVAGE and Mrs. Louise ROUSELAUX." Mr. Hanscome married Miss Anna Lappan 25 Oct 1857. She died in June 1912. At the time of his death, Mr. HANSCOME was 83 years and 22 days old and had lived in Lawrence since 1854.

Here on 15 Oct, a meeting was held with a view to the organization of a Union Church. This meeting adjourned to Sunday 22 Oct at which date the Plymouth Congregational Church was organized. Married Oliver A. Hanscom 13 Oct 1857.

p 90 Mrs. Forrest SAVAGE - Lydia WORTH, b Hanover, NH 27 Jan 1830; m Forrest SAVAGE 8 Mar 1849; in fall of 1855 came to Lawrence; four children: William, Emma, May and Frank; d Lawrence 24 Aug 1914.

p 91 Ethan Allen SMITH, b Andover, VT 4 May 1832; to Lawrence 1857; in banking business until 1861, to Washington DC position in Indian Bureau until 1865; returned to Lawrence and helped to organize the First National Bank of which he became cashier. The following year went into the hotel business. In 1874, started NORWOOD Stock Farm of 300 acres west of Lawrence. The fine horses from the NORWOOD Farm have made the name famous. Was a member of the Legislature for two years, and a member of the Masonic body in the Knights Templar rank. He died in Lawrence 22 Mar 1914.

pp 92-93 Col. H. S. NOORE, d 1914; b Mantua, OH 25 Feb 1837; his father, a native of Granby, CT; to Lawrence 1858; served in the 2nd Kansas Infantry; m 1864 Esther HARMON of OH, daughter of a pioneer of MA; left wife and two sons.

p 94 Paul LEARNARD, b Lawrence 25 Sept 1868; father, a native of VT; mother, native of MA; m Anna DYKE of Burlington, VT 1895; d 1914; survived by wife and one son, Burdick.

p 95 Mrs. Wilder S. METCALF - Mary CROSIER METCALF, b Sullivan, Ashland County, OH 4 Jun 1857; m Wilder METCALF 30 Jul 1878; to KS nine years later; d Lawrence 8 Sept 1914.

p 96 Oliver A. HANSCOM, (handwritten obituary) b Portsmouth NH 13 Oct 1831; d Lawrence 4 Nov 1914; had five children, three survive him.

Printed news item: Mrs. Leonora S. HOLLINGBERRY, who died at the SIMONS Hospital Saturday night, left a will devoting her property at 841 Maine St. to be used as a home for girls in Lawrence. A farm consisting of 160 acres some distance from town is by the terms of the will to be used for the support of the home thus founded. "Her house will be used to its capacity in providing a home for girls in Lawrence who are working for small wages, and who have no families or whose families live elsewhere". The Unitarian church is named as trustee for the home, and will have charge of the administration of the property. It will be known as the Ricker Home for Girls. The cause of death was cancer. She was fifty-seven years old.

MORSE 19 Oct 1869; to Lawrence first week in Nov 1869; a resident forty-five years; survived by husband, a brother, Dr. Frank L. SMITH and his four children; burial at Monson, MA.

p 104 Forrest SAVAGE, b Hartford, VT 27 Sept 1826; youngest son of William and Polly HAREN SAVAGE; m Lydia G. WORTH 8 Mar 1849; to Lawrence 9 Sept 1894; pre-empted farm west of Lawrence 1894; moved to Lawrence where he died 17 Aug 1915.

p 105 Mrs. Ann MERRILL JENKINS, b Hanover NH 2 May 1823; her father, Dr. MERRILL, practiced medicine many years in Hanover; moved with family to Lockport, IL; m ?Craius? JENKINS and came to Lawrence 1854. They became identified with the Free State people and Mr. JENKINS was at one time a prisoner in the power of the pro-slavery party. In 1858 he was murdered by one James Lane, afterwards U. S. Senator. After his murder, Mrs. JENKINS cared for her three children and brought them up to be an honor to the city and useful members of society. She died 30 Aug 1915, age 92 yrs. 4 mo.

p 106 Mrs. Rose BROCK SMITH, b Leavenworth County 23 May 1867; moved to Greenwood County; educated at Eureka, and University of Kansas; to Ottawa 1891; had record of being one of the best primary teachers in the state; m F. A. SMITH 1893; d Lawrence 29 Sept 1915.

p 107 Alexander MONROE, son of Donald MONROE and Jeannette ROSS MONROE, in the County of Ross and Cromarty in northern part of Scotland. They left Scotland 1843. Alexander born on shipboard on the banks of New Foundland 2 Aug 1843. Landed at Salem, MA; enlisted in Civil War in Co. F 23rd Massachusetts Infantry; m. 17 Nov 1864 in Salem; to Lawrence 1882; elected President of Merchants National Bank 1890; resigned in 1914 due to failing health; d 24 Dec 1916; left wife and three children.

BANKS - Helen Mary HEWITT, daughter of Jason and Cynthia BROWN HEWITT, b North Granville, NY 13 Spet 1836; moved to Winona County, MN 1850; to Lawrence 13 Jul 1857 to work for her mother's cousin, G. W. BROWN, publisher of the Herald of Freedom; m (1) Dr. Jerome GRISWOLD 9 May 1859; had two children; Dr. GRISWOLD murdered in QUANTRELL'S Raid Aug 21 1863; in 1870 m (2) Mr. BANKS; had two children, one died in infancy; she d 10 Jan 1915.

p 110 Charles L. EDWARDS, (newspaper clipping, not dated) b Southhampton, MA 19 Oct 1828; to Lawrence 1855; was the first school head in Lawrence 1857-59; was first elected superintendent of public instruction in Douglas County, took charge of the office 1 March 1859 when there were but three organized schools. Within three months thirty schools were in operation in the county; was one of first trustees of what has become the University of Kansas, and was principal of the academic department which opened in fall of 1859. In 1860 he accepted position of principal of Southhampton Academy until spring of 1862. Married 4 Oct 1860 in North Hadley, MA (written obit. given marriage date as 1862 and name of wife, Susan R. POWERS of South Hadley, MA). In 1862 enlisted in 37th Massachusetts Infantry, Co D. At close of war, retired as a Major in his regiment. Was one of founders and charter members of Plymouth Congregational Church; held office of treasurer over half a century. Survived by daughter, Miss Virginia EDWARDS. Died 22 Nov 1916; buried Oak Hill cemetery.

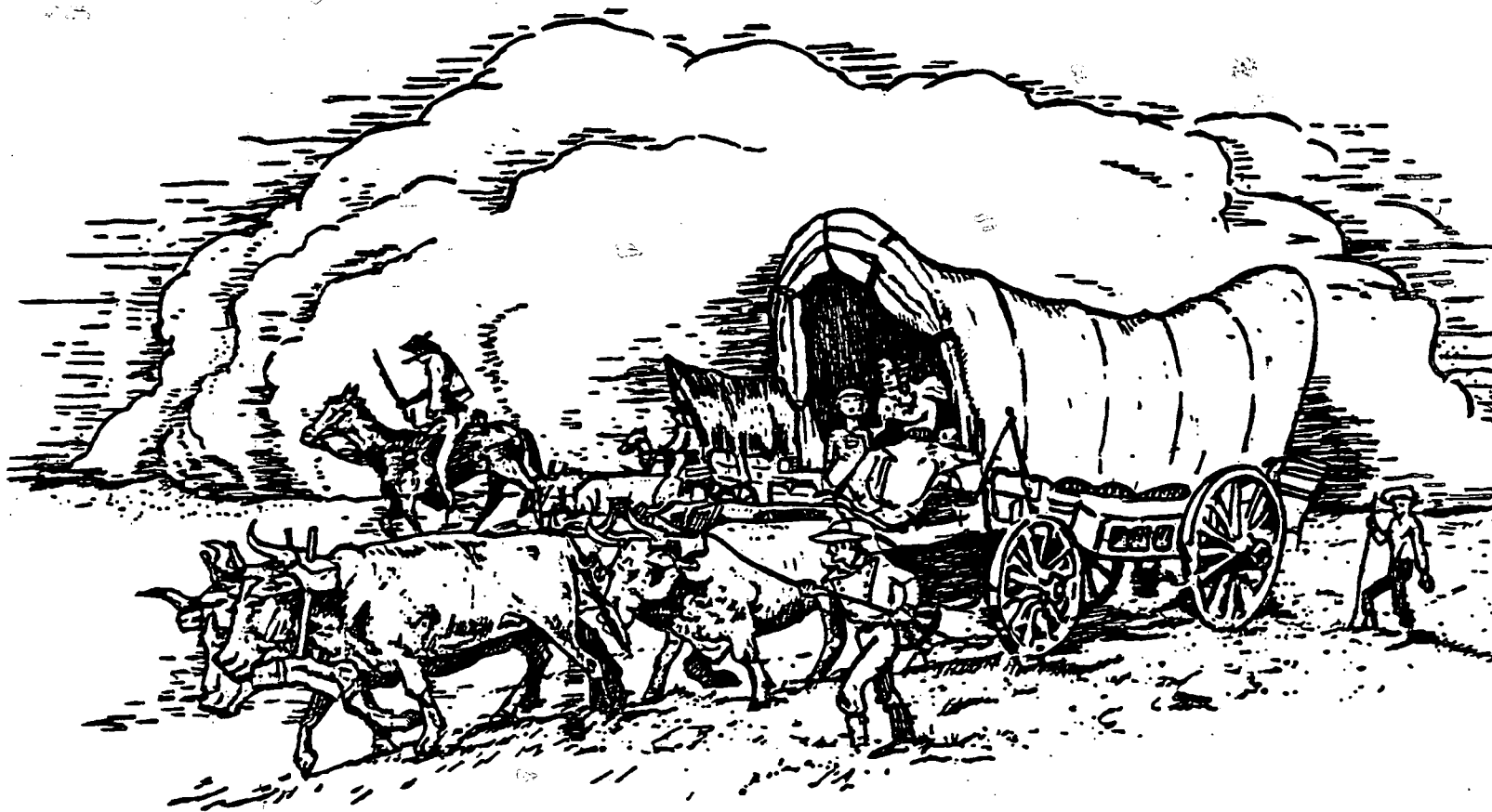



Spencer Research Library (Kansas Collection) - Many biographies of early Kansas residents; diaries, county histories of Kansas; maps and atlases, such as Sanborn City Maps 1880's to 1920's, county and city plat maps for Kansas; etc.; city directories; Douglas county court records, such as tax rolls, register of deeds mortgage records, jail books, etc. (originals) - some from 1855; several old Kansas newspapers on microfilm; photograph collection; and many other original documents and letters relating to Kansas settler and Kansas history; slave narratives on microfilm.
2. Spencer Research Library (Documents Section- basement) - Census materials (on microfilm) State of Kansas 1855-1915 (ten year intervals) and Kansas Federal 1854-61 and 1860, 1870, 1880, 1900 and 1900 Soundex. Many government documents such as Kansas Claims, State Papers, Land papers. Several indexes to the government documents, especially helpful is the index called Grassroots America.
3. Watson Library - Jayhawk Boulevard, University of Kansas - Many books on various states. Several county histories, especially for Missouri and Kansas; Biography and Genealogy Master Index (at reference desk) lists biographical sources; various Who's Who volumes; a series of books of slave narratives. Some microfilm copies of various newspapers in the U.S.; Draper Collection on microfilm.
4. Law Library (Green Hall) - 15th Street - Some indexes which give names of individuals involved in certain kinds of court cases, some dating back to about 1700.

- B. Lawrence Public Library - 707 Vermont St. - Old city directories for Lawrence, beginning 1860; many old Lawrence newspapers on microfilm dating back to 1855; Lawrence phone books dating back to 1916 (not all years are available); Many biographical books and other volumes which concern the History of Kansas and Lawrence (most are stored in a glass case in the library); Index to the Rural Cemeteries of Douglas Co. Also, housed at the Lawrence Public Library are the Douglas Co. Genealogical Society holdings including many exchange quarterlies from various states and the D.A.R. holdings which includes many volumes of genealogical and historical interest.

Lecompte: We understand that a city to be named Lecompte, in honor of the Chief Justice of this Territory, is being laid out on the Kansas river, about 12 miles above this point, and a few miles above Douglas, by Mr. Geo. Clark, formerly Indian agent in Kansas. A surveyor is already on the ground, and has commenced operations surveying out the streets, &c. Mr. Clark is the man that destroyed the house of our friend, Jones, several weeks since, and figured as one of the indignant sovereign squatters at the late indignation meeting in this city.

Post Office: C. W. Babcock, Esq. has been appointed Postmaster of this city. He will soon commence the building of an office on Massachusetts street. A two-horse hack, to carry the mail from Lawrence to Westport, Mo, twice a week will commence running in a few days.

Herald of Freedom, Jan. 27, 1855

A Free School in Lawrence: A free school was commenced in this city a few weeks since, taught by Mr. Fitch. A meeting of the citizens was held on the evening of the 18th inst., at the school room. The meeting was organized by the choice of Mr. Samuel F. Tappan, President and Dr. S.C. Harrington, Secretary. A school committee of three was appointed for the ensuing year, consisting of Dr. Robinson, Dr. Doy, and J. S. Emery, Esq. Mr. Samuel F. Tappan was chosen clerk. We are informed enough money has been subscribed to carry on the school for three and a half months.

Lawrence Athaeneum: The following gentlemen constitute the officers of the Athaeneum: J. S. Emery, President; A. H. Mallory, C. S. Pratt, Vice-Presidents; John Hutchinson, Corresponding Secretary; E. D. Ladd, Recording Secretary and Treasurer; S. N. Wood, Librarian; C. Robinson, S. C. Pomeroy, S. Y. Lum, John Mailey, S. J. Willis, Regents.

Extracted from a Volume called: Kansas Claims House Reports 36th Congress
2nd Session (2 vol.)

The following are examples of the many interesting testimonies to be found in the two volumes of "Kansas Claims". These claims were made by Kansas citizens in the 1850's and often contain information concerning place of origin, names of family members, political views, etc. Volumes may be consulted in the Documents Section of Spencer Research Library on the University of Kansas Campus, Lawrence, Kansas.

 In the matter of the petition of Benjamin S. Hancock.

Margaretta Hancock, sworn, says: That she is the wife of petitioner, and that in the years 1855 and 1856 we were living on our claim two and a half miles from Lecompton. He was from Pittsburg, Pennsylvania, and a free-State man, and not in good odor with the people of Lecompton on account of his political opinions. In the year 1855, during the Wakarusa war, Mr. Hancock came to Lawrence to save his life, and help, while protecting himself, to protect others. While he was gone, some men from Lecompton came and threw down our fences, and the cattle got in and destroyed our corn. There were nine or ten acres in corn; it was sod corn. Mr. Hancock had gathered a little of the corn to feed with before he came down to Lawrence; the rest destroyed. It was pretty good sod corn. This was all we lost of much value during that year.

In the month of August or September, 1856, while my husband was absent-- having fled to save his life--a company of men, calling themselves Kickapoo Rangers, about fifty in number, came to our house. It was Sunday morning. They were commanded by one John Randolph. He paraded his men before the house, ordered the men to go in and search the house, and take what they could find for the use of the southern army. The men entered the house from both sides, began swearing, saying we had a store for the abolitionists at Lawrence, but they would not get it. Then they commenced plundering; some in one room; some in the other; some up stairs, turning over the beds, taking the blankets, swearing they were too good for abolitionists; inquired for Mr. Hancock; swore if they had him they would kill him. They took coffee, sugar, crackers, meat, harness--several sets, &c.

They took all my provisions. I expostulated with them; told them they were gentlemen to take all I had to eat, my husband being gone, and I having two little ones to attend to. Mr. Lamb then took a piece of meat, some dried fruit, and a washpan full of coffee, and gave them to me. Captain Randolph got mad, ordered Mr. Lamb to leave his company, as his conduct was a disgrace to it; that he was a coward and a traitor to his company. Lamb said he would not see a woman hungry. Pistols were drawn by Randolph, who said the next thing taken out of the wagon he would shoot the man who did it. Lamb wanted to leave a sack of flour, but was compelled to give it up. Randolph made a speech, saying, among other things, he would go over with his things to Lecompton, and come back again. They broke and destroyed everything they could lay their hands on that they did not carry away. That afternoon about 300 men came on horseback, accompanied by some wagons; picked up what they wanted, threw down the fence; drove and rode through the cornfield, set fire to the house three times, but it was put out. The barn and its contents they burnt down. There were in it ploughs and chests of tools and everything necessary to carry on a farm.

Between the two visits on that day I had obtained a guard from Colonel Cooke, and had thrown a few light things into the wagon. The last body who came even tried to rob the wagon of the few things it contained, but were successfully resisted by the guard.

Myself and mother came back to the house after the barn was burned, and, waiting till dark, hid some things by covering them up in the garden, but they were all stolen and broken up.

The items in the house and barn, as set down in the petition, were all carried away, destroyed, or burned up at that time, except the items for spoons. There

were twelve large spoons, silver, worth \$36, and 12 small ones, worth \$10; these were carried away. The preserves were worth \$1 per gallon. Ten acres of corn and over were destroyed at the same time, the fence being thrown down. What they did not pack off, the cattle and hogs destroyed. An acre of potatoes was also dug up and destroyed. Three horses were taken off.

When Mr. Hancock came into the Territory he brought twenty-five wagon loads of goods, such as is set out in his petition, and two loads afterwards.

Douglas County, ss:

Sophia Eggert, being duly sworn, says: I am the wife of petitioner, Henry Eggert; on the 11th day of September, 1856, we lived on our claim, about a mile southwest of Franklin, in this county, and have lived there since; a great many men came to our house that day; Mr. Eggert was hid; it was the day Franklin was burned; they took away some of our chickens, we had over a hundred before they came, and they only left us forty; they were worth \$4 per dozen; I would not take three bits a piece for them; they took all our bed clothes, left our feather beds, took an umbrella, razor, carving knife, two butcher knives, chair, and many other things that I can't remember, worth, in all, \$200.; they took four of our best milch cows, worth \$45 apiece; they rode our horse till he was so hurt that we thought he would die; they rode him one night and one day only, we could not use him all summer; I don't know how much he was damaged, I think at least \$50.

E. B. Johnston, sworn, says: I know petitioner, have known him for three years, during all which time he has lived in this Territory, and is a citizen of the Territory now; I am his near neighbor; in the month of September, at the same time Franklin was burned, the army that burned Franklin, under General Reed, drove off four cows, the property of petitioner; I was taken prisoner, saw the cows of petitioner with twenty or thirty other of my neighbors' cattle driven off in that drove; other droves were added to these from time to time, and all penned in the lot of Billy Wallace, in Franklin; the cows were worth \$30 each; he has never recovered them; I know nothing of his other losses.
