Report of the Librarian

TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE

LAWRENCE FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY.

Herewith is respectfully submitted my report of the work of the Lawrence Free

Public Library during its sixth fiscal year ending December 31st, 1910.

The total accessions for the year were 679. The number worn out and withdrawn from circulation were 409, a net gain of 270, making the number of books in circulation at the close of 1910, 10362, which are classified as follows:

Total. Of the 679 volumes added, 580 were by purchase, 30 of which were from the Perkins Memorial Fund, and 99 were by gift. Divided into classes, 411 were non-fiction and 268 were fiction. The number of borrowers' cards issued during the year was 1137, making the total registration of borrowers 3314.

The circulation statistics are as follows:

The circulation has decreased 1036. This is entirely in the fiction departments, owing probably to the fact that the library is not able to purchase the late fiction promptly. A gain of 219 in the circulation of non-fiction is encouraging as is also a gain of 879 in non-fiction used as reference in the reading rooms. The statistics show 5783 books used in 1910 against 4804 used in 1909. These books, as has been noted in previous reports, are books reserved for the use of students in the library building, owing to the lack of funds to provide sufficient numbers for circulation.

There have been 431 volumes rebound and 58 volumes of periodicals bound, a

total of 489 volumes, 62 volumes more than last year.

Mr. Grovenor's Christmas gift is the new Census edition of the Rand, McNally atlas,

to be delivered in the spring.

The gift of Mrs. L. H. Perkins was a beautifully illustrated edition de luxe of Ruskin's complete works in 30 volumns, a most valuable addition to the non-fiction department, as was also Mr. M. G. Manley's gift of the 1843 edition of the New England Primer and the 1848, 2 vol. edition of Catlin's Travels in Europe with his North American Indian collection.

The Watkins bank and Mrs. L. H. Perkins presented the library with sixty-six chairs for the assembly room, a practical gift which has proven of more than ordinary value. Miss Kate Riggs was granted the use of this room for her afternoon Bible study classes on Tuesdays.

The Story Hour, which was inaugurated over a year ago, has been continued successfully throughout the past year. The average attendance was 55. The stories were told by Miss Edwards, teachers of the primary grades, Miss Walker and students of the expression department of K. U., and Mr. H. E. Steele, of the manual training school.

The library has made a change in the rules whereby teachers may take 10 volumes of non-fiction to their school rooms for the use of the children during recess or vacant hours. If the library had more funds for the purchase of books, we would be glad to make the number 25 instead of 10 as this form of extension work is very beneficial to the children.

Another change in rules much appreciated by many patrons is the issuing of a non-fiction card, thus giving each borrower two cards. It is probably due to this change that the circulation of non-fiction has increased.

The library staff wishes to express its appreciation of the many favors of the Board

during the past year.
